STEPS OF IMPLEMENTING PROJECT



Selection of schools from ASPNet. Training workshop $-11-15^{th}$ of January. Preceded with an introductory meeting on the 15^{th} of December, 2020



Analysis of working curriculum and worked on a preliminary selection of elements and approaches



Choosing partners: peers in school; parents; community members; other experts



Preparation and implementation of activities: lessons and extracurricular events

Selection of ICH elements



Selection of grades and time for activities



Selection of materials (UNESCO materials, literature, video, audio) and pedagogical tools

•3 teachers from each school + 1 management representative



•235 students: 111 girls and 125 boys

•The number of periods taught during the pilot -20










CASE STUDY: SHEZHIRE

In biology, students explored the notions of human heredity, genetic code, and DNA. The teacher introduced the rules and basic symbols used in genealogy.

History classes guided them into structuring historical events through the prism of their family stories.

To memorize and recite the relationships between their ancestors, students acquired new vocabulary on kinship during their Kazakh language class.






CASE STUDY: SCHOOL FESTIVAL "SPRING OF ZHETISU-2021"

- School-wide event open to all grades and encompassing all subjects
- Scientific conference for primary students: presentations about different plants and herbs, such as dandelion, mint, dyer's woad, wild rue, gourd, etc. through the prism of different subjects
- > Students studied a plant from a biological perspective: interviewed their parents and grandparents on the use of these plants in their everyday life
- A student chose to study pots made out of gourd together with Uyghur language and arts teachers: interview wits master craftsman to introduce the art of decorating gourds
- Invited PhD student in Chemistry as an expert who commented on each presentation, validating or complementing the information provided by the young speakers

MAIN CHALLENGES

- Timing: health issues seasonal sickness
- Scheduling: unclear sanitary and epidemiological situation
- Concept of ICH: talk about objects or tangible culture rather than ICH
- Teaching ABOUT ICH rather than WITH ICH
- Partners' cooperation busy schedule
- Linkage to GCED
